Board's Perspective

Dear Members and Friends,

As we enter a period of reflection on our level of willingness to be generous, and with the keen awareness that we are a mere two months away from candidating week, we suggest that the time is ripe for us to ask ourselves these Mission questions: "What is the vision we hold for UUCM? How do we want UUCM to feel in six months, one year, or five years? Will there be vital programs? How are we treating each other? And, what is our relationship to the larger community: are we insular or outward reaching?" The intentions we hold right now, our actions, and the choices we are making presently will determine what we become.

Regardless of denomination, churches go through common changes based on attendance size. Shifts happen when average attendance levels reach specific limits during a church's growth cycle. Churches can make a conscious choice to stay the size they are. The Ministerial Search Survey had questions to determine just what UUCM members want; approximately 70% of respondents expressed that growth was favorable, approximately 30% were neutral.

We are in the midst of a size change from Family size church (1-75 in attendance) to Pastoral size (51-175). The shift issues for this transition, as cited by Robert Latham, are: Leadership, Trust, and asking "Why are we here?" In this respect we are right on track. The transition from one stage to another can be traumatic, painful, and leaders are often the casualties of the resistance to these changes.

If UUCM fails to make the shift in organization and function, we can easily enter the 'maintenance mode'. This is characterized by minimal vision, motivation, commitment, voluntarism, resources, and energy. To stay small is a valid choice. However, it is just not the one your BOT has heard from you. As a result the BOT has been working for over two years to create an infrastructure, foundation and boundaries for healthy growth, but we cannot do this alone. We must have the congregation's support to succeed.

As we hold in our heart the hope to successfully call a settled minister, your generosity of heart matters greatly. What you give, not just your money, but your time, your trust, and whether or not your intention is loving and selfless, will determine our course.

Vision Day Review

Our second Vision Day was held the end of January with participation from the Board and Committee Chairs and/or representatives. We started by looking back at our meeting in 2015 and acknowledging the successes of the past year in the key areas that we had identified as needing the most attention: Children & Youth, Music, Social Justice, and Communications/Organization.

Progress included restructuring the RE program and starting a children's music group. A new Music Director was hired to play the piano and direct the choir. In three workshops, the congregation identified two Social Justice areas for UUCM focus: Environmental Justice and Economic Justice. Communications/Organization accomplishments included a new publicity manager, weekly e-blasts, improved Mountain Chalice, printed events list, revitalizing UUCM Facebook page,

updated and current website, implementation of a Member Forum, and selection of new database software. Working with committees and other members, the BOT revised bylaws, created new policies for Building Use, Child & Youth Safety, Background checks, BOT Meetings, and Paid Leave with updates to the Personnel Manual.

This year in our Vision Day Leadership Workshop we identified three areas to work on: Membership, Stewardship, and Administration. The Membership Committee is considering a new member mentoring program, increasing fellowship opportunities, and continued focus on personal invitations to new members for Circle Suppers.

Stewardship will be concentrating on creating a mindset of abundance rather than scarcity, and increasing awareness of generosity in our lives. Other opportunities for improvement include a better understanding of the governance structure/process at UUCM, review of the feedback loop from Congregation to BOT, and continuing Town Talks four times a year.

The Home Stretch

By the time you are reading this, the Ministerial Search Committee (MSC) will have completed two of our three pre-candidate visits. Our final visit will take place in March. By the end of March we will have had the opportunity to meet with each pre-candidate, have meals with them, introduce them to the area, and have in-depth conversations to explore their personal style, professional approach, strengths, and possible weaknesses.

The ministers have also been assessing us. What are our strengths and challenges as a congregation? Who are we, where do we shine, and where do we need guidance? Are those characteristics a good match with their own talents and the work they feel called to do?

Toward the end of each visit, the MSC will have traveled with each minister to a neutral pulpit where we'll have had a chance to hear each of them present a worship service and deliver a sermon.

After all three pre-candidates have met with the MSC, the committee will sit down together to discuss and evaluate each of the ministers. We will review again all of the information we have received from the applicants, including their Ministerial Record, their Packet, their references, their answers to questions we raised in the Skype interviews, our discussions with them when they came for their pre-candidate weekend visit, their preaching style, and our overall impression of their personality (did anyone really resonate with us on a personal level; did anyone feel like a particularly good fit with the UUCM culture). We'll also pay close attention to the questions they ask of us. It is our expectation that our deliberations will take many hours over the course of several meetings.

The Committee hopes to name the final candidate by mid-April. "Candidating Week," as it is called, will run from April 30 through May 8. During that nine-day period you will get your chance to listen to the candidate deliver two sermons, meet the candidate personally, and evaluate the person we believe is the best fit for UUCM. We await those days with great hope and anticipation!

Overdevelopment + Overpopulation = Overshoot is the other, donated by Carol Kuczora. This book contains poetic essays about the inexorable march of escalating human population and the consequent depletion of all other life forms in the web of relations that makes up the planetary life-support system. Both books are lavishly illustrated with pictures of both great beauty and heart-breaking devastation, and they include essays by many authors. These are

lessons we ignore at our peril.
