Bylaws



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1 Article I. Name

2 The name of our religious Community is Unitarian Universalist Community of the Mountains (UUCM).

3 Article II. Purpose

- 4 The purpose of our Community is to foster liberal religious living through worship, study, service and
- 5 fellowship. We seek the enjoyment of religion founded upon devotion to individual freedom of belief.
- 6 Relying upon reason as our guide, and upon freedom as our method, we seek to grow in understanding
- 7 of ourselves and of our world, and to promote and serve the universal human family.

8 Article III. Members

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A. Meaning of Membership

Being a Member of UUCM means being in covenantal relationship with other Members, committing to support UUCM and its Mission with time, energy, talent and treasure, and agreeing with the Seven Principles of the Unitarian Universalist Association, declaring personal identification as a Unitarian Universalist.

Members of UUCM are also members of the Unitarian Universalist Association.

B. Eligibility

Membership is open to any person 18 years of age or older, regardless of creed, race, gender, sexual orientation, ethnic and national origin, social status, economic status, marital status, or disability.

Membership status may be extended to youths younger than 18 years of age, if approved by the Minister and sponsored by an adult member (who is not their parent or legal guardian) of the congregation.

C. Requirements & Privileges

Members are those who are in sympathy with the Community's purpose, have signed the Membership Book, participate in the life of the congregation as they are able, agree to abide by UUCM Covenant of Right Relations and/or Behavioral Covenant, and make an annual financial Pledge with an annual financial contribution of record, and actively support the Community by participating in Community programs and activities as they are willing and able. Exceptions to the financial contribution requirement may be granted one year at a time for specific individuals at the discretion of the Minister

Members may stand for elected office and serve on any committee, team, work group or task force. Members under 18 years of age may not hold positions of fiscal responsibility.

Members may vote 30 (thirty) days after signing the Membership Book.

D. Release from Membership

Members may be released from Membership:

- 1) upon the Member's death,
- 2) upon resignation by the Member, preferably in writing to the Minister or Board President, or
- 3) if a Pledge for the fiscal year has not been received by the Treasurer prior to July 30 and a financial contribution of record has not been received for the previous fiscal year.

A Member, Friend, or visitor may be excluded or expelled for destructive behavior or destructive disregard of the UUCM Covenant of Right Relations and/or Behavioral Covenant.

42 Process for Removal

- 1) In the event of death, resignation, or failure to meet the financial obligation (as defined in Article III C, 1), a Member may be released by the Board of Trustees as determined by a vote of two-thirds of the Board.
- In the case of destructive behavior or destructive disregard of the UUCM Covenant of Right Relations and/or Behavioral Covenant, the UUCM Safety Policy will be followed.
- 3) The UUCM Safety Policy will be in harmony with UUCM values, mission and Covenant of Right Relations and/or Behavioral Covenant.
- 4) The wellbeing of the community as a whole shall be given priority over the privileges and inclusion of an individual whose behavior is dangerous or destructive.
- 5) Should the Safety Response Team decide that exclusion or expulsion from UUCM is necessary, they will consult the Minister and President of the Board of Trustees prior to action being taken.

E. Reinstatement

A Member who resigned or who was removed from membership for failure to meet the financial obligation and later wishes to rejoin UUCM as a Member, shall meet with the Minister. Upon recommendation by the Minister, the Board of Trustees will approve reinstatement as determined by a vote of two-thirds of the Board. The reinstated Member will comply with Article III, A, B, and C.

Any person who was excluded or expelled from UUCM may personally request the Board of Trustees for reinstatement. The Board will review the request and respond within (60) sixty days as to whether or not to reinstate the removed person. The decision of the Board shall be final and not subject to further appeal.

A reinstatement request may be made no sooner than one year following the removal. In the event that a reinstatement request is not granted, any subsequent reinstatement requests may be made no sooner than one year following the person being informed of a negative decision on the previous request.

Article IV. Friends

A. Eligibility

A Friend of the Community is someone over the age of 18 who chooses not to be a voting Member but would like to make an annual financial Pledge and an annual financial contribution of record, while actively supporting the Community through participation in Community programs and activities as they are willing and able. In signing a UUCM Pledge Statement, a Friend of UUCM agrees to abide by the UUCM Covenant of Right Relations and /or Behavioral Covenant.

B. Privileges

Friends may participate fully in most aspects of spiritual and social activities of congregational life – including worship services, social events, choir, classes and workshops. Friends may also participate in nondecision-making roles on certain Ministry Teams or Ministry Task Forces at the discretion of the Minister. Although Friends may not serve as Committee members, on the Ministry Council or be in an elected position, they may serve on work groups or other

- nondecision-making and non-voting groups. Friend status may be revoked or reinstated under the same conditions as defined in Article III, D and E.
- Friends are not eligible to vote.

87 Article V. Denomination Affiliation

- 88 This Community is a member of the Unitarian Universalist Association and of the Pacific Central
- 89 District. It is the intention of this Community to make annual Fair Share financial contributions to the
- 90 Association and the District.

91 Article VI. Fiscal Year

The fiscal year of the Unitarian Universalist Community of the Mountains shall be July 1 through June

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Article VII. Congregational Business Meetings

A. Annual and Special Congregational Business Meetings

The Annual Congregational Business Meeting is held in May at a time and place chosen by the Board of Trustees. The Board may call a Special Congregational Business Meeting at any time. The Board must call a Special Congregational Business Meeting upon written request signed by ten percent (10%) of the Members.

B. Notice of Meetings

The business to be transacted at a Congregational Business Meeting shall be set forth in a written notice of the meeting, which shall be sent to all Members by email, newsletter and bulletin board at least fourteen (14) days prior to the meeting.

C. Quorum and Voting

- 1) Twenty percent (20%) of the Members qualified to vote and present in person constitutes a quorum except for decisions specified in Article VII.C.2 below. A simple majority of those present in person or by written proxy is needed for a vote to pass except for decisions specified in Article VII.C.2 below. Written proxies must be delivered to the secretary prior to the meeting being called to order.
- 2) Forty percent (40%) of the Members qualified to vote and present in person constitutes a quorum for the following decisions: buying or selling real property, calling or dismissing a Minister, or amending or replacing the bylaws. A two-thirds (2/3) majority vote is needed to amend or replace the bylaws. A four-fifths (4/5) majority vote is needed to buy or sell real property. Proxy voting is not allowed for these decisions.
- 3) Voting will be by a show of Voting Cards unless a written ballot is requested by the presiding officer or by any two voting Members.
- 4) Absentee ballots are not allowed.

D. Agenda for Annual Congregational Business Meetings

Unless otherwise approved by the Members present, the agenda for the Annual Congregational Business Meeting shall include:

- 1) President's Report
- 2) Minister's Report.
- 3) Treasurer's Report.
- 124 4) Submission of the next fiscal year's Annual Budget for discussion and adoption.

- 5) Election of Members to the Board of Trustees.
 - 6) Election of Members to the Nominating Committee.
 - 7) Other items that may be brought by the Board of Trustees.

E. Electronic Meetings

If unusual circumstances of health or safety require, as set out in any applicable governmental directive, any meeting of the Congregation described in this Article may be held in electronic format, and the actions taken at such a meeting will have the same full force and effect as if Members were present in person.

Article VIII. Officers and Board of Trustees

A. Board Membership

The Board of Trustees is comprised of the following Members:

- 1) A President, with a one (1) year term.
- 2) A Vice President, with a one (1) year term.
- 3) A Treasurer, with a two (2) year term.
- 4) A Secretary, with a one (1) year term.
- 5) Three (3) Trustees at Large, each with a staggered two (2) year term.

B. <u>Board's Powers and Responsibilities</u>

- 1) The President, Vice President, Treasurer, and Secretary are officers of the Board of Trustees. The officers shall perform the duties as defined in these bylaws and their job descriptions, as developed by the Board. The Board has general charge of the Community, the conduct of its business affairs, and the control of its administration, including the establishment of Committees. It may fill Board, Nominating Committee, Endowment Fund Committee, and Ministerial Search Committee vacancies with persons who shall serve until the next Annual Congregational Business Meeting.
- 2) At the Annual Congregational Business Meeting, the Board and Minister shall submit next year's proposed General Funds Budget for approval by the Members. The Board and Minister shall authorize expenditures and incur financial obligations in accordance with the approved Annual Budget. The Board may also authorize expenditures and incur financial obligations over and above the approved Annual Budget, not to exceed twenty (20) percent of the General Funds Investments plus the General Funds projected net profit/loss for the fiscal year. This restriction does not apply to special funds raised in accordance with the Board's instructions for special projects. In carrying out the delegated tasks, Committee Chairs may incur financial obligations within their budgets without the approval of the Board. The Board may not reduce a Committee's budget by more than twenty-five percent, except as authorized by a Special Congregational Business Meeting.
- 3) The Minister may, without the approval of the Board, incur financial obligations within the total Ministry budget, reallocating funds within the various Ministries while not exceeding the total Ministry budget. The Board and Finance Committee will be notified of the reallocation before their next scheduled meetings.
- 4) The Board may decline to accept any financial gifts or tendered property which in their opinion would not be of any benefit, would be difficult to administer, would expose the congregation to a liability, or would be inconsistent with the principles or tax-exempt

- status of UUCM. This includes gifts of tangible property or financial gifts with conditions as to the use of the principle or income. For a gift of \$2,000 or more which is not specifically designated the Board shall decide how the funds will be used.
 - 5) The Board does not have the power to buy or sell real property, to commit the Community to become a partner to any real property agreement, to call or dismiss a settled Minister, or to amend or replace the bylaws as stated in Article VII.C.2.
 - 6) In order to promote efficiency in the best interests of UUCM, the Board may from time to time adopt, amend, or repeal policies and guidelines as may be necessary to implement, interpret, or clarify provisions of these bylaws.
 - Such policies and guidelines shall be consistent with the letter, spirit, or intent of the bylaws, and will be published to Members and Friends fourteen (14) days in advance of Board approval of the policy.
 - 7) The Board of Trustees shall cause a review of Membership to be made annually and certify the current Membership List at that time. Only Members certified by the Annual Census are considered in the population count of the Community as reported to the Unitarian Universalist Association.

C. Quorum for Board Meeting

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A quorum for a Board of Trustees meeting requires all of the following three (3) conditions to be met:

- 1) The President or Vice President must be present.
- 2) A minimum of two (2) officers must be present.
- 3) A minimum of four (4) Board Members must be present.

D. Monthly Board Business Meetings

The Board shall meet monthly at a time and place chosen by the Board Members. The Board may call for additional meetings if needed.

E. Notice of Regular Monthly Board Business Meetings

The Community shall be notified of the date, time and place of the regular monthly Board meeting by way of verbal announcement at weekly services, and/or by written communication in the bulletin or newsletter at least fourteen (14) days prior to the meeting.

F. Emergency Session Board Meetings

The Board may meet in emergency sessions without notification of the Community.

G. <u>Procedure</u>

All business meetings of the Board will be open, unless the Board shall decide that an Executive Session is essential to the consideration of the business at hand. All voting will be held in open sessions.

H. Election of Board Members

The President, Vice President and Secretary shall be elected at each Annual Congregational Business Meeting. In order to be elected President, the Member must have served previously on the Board of Trustees or have comparable or equivalent experience. The Treasurer will be elected every two years. The candidates will be proposed by the Nominating Committee and additional nominations may be proposed from the floor. The Trustees-At-Large shall be elected at Annual Congregational Business Meetings, two (2) on even numbered years and one (1) on odd numbered years. Only one (1) consecutive re-election is allowed for any position

I. <u>Termination of Board Membership</u>

The position of a Member of the Board of Trustees who misses three (3) regular Board meetings in a twelve-month period may be declared vacant and a replacement may be appointed by the Board if four (4) months or more remain until the next Annual Congregational Business Meeting. Said Member shall be notified by the Secretary of impending termination by written notice mailed not less five (5) days before the fourth regular Board meeting.

Article IX. Calling a Minister

A. Ministerial Search Committee

When a Congregational Business Meeting determines the readiness to call a Minister, a Search Committee of five to seven Members shall be selected in accordance with the ministerial search guidelines of the Unitarian Universalist Association. The Search Committee shall follow the ministerial search guidelines of the Unitarian Universalist Association and shall operate in a confidential manner. When the committee has selected a suitable candidate, it shall arrange to present the candidate's credentials to the Community in accordance with Unitarian Universalist Association guidelines.

B. Duties

The Minister shall perform the duties customary to that office in liberal churches, shall work in close cooperation with the officers, the Board of Trustees and committees, and committees, shall have primary responsibility for the spiritual and ethical life of the Community. The Guidelines of the Unitarian Universalist Ministers Association shall serve as a standard for the professional conduct of the Minister and for the relations between the Minister and the Community. The Minister shall be an advisor to the Board of Trustees and shall advise committees (except the Nominating committee) as appropriate. The Minister shall be free at all times to express honest convictions and beliefs. The Minister shall be encouraged to participate actively in the life of the denomination and of the Community and shall have the support and assistance of the Community in properly allocating time between obligations to the Community and needs for family privacy, recreation, study, and professional development.

C. Rights and Responsibilities

The Minister and Community share responsibility for the religious meetings and overall program of the Community. The Board of Trustees and the Minister are jointly responsible for an annual evaluation of the Community's program and ministry. The Minister shall have freedom of the pulpit as well as freedom to express his or her opinion outside the pulpit.

D. Call and Employment Contract

The Minister shall be called upon recommendation of the Ministerial Search Committee by a 90% majority of the Members of the Community present at a meeting called for the purpose; a quorum for such a meeting is 40% of the Members. The ministerial agreement will specify the duties and compensation of the Minister.

E. <u>Dismissal</u>

The Minister may be dismissed by a 30% vote of the Members of the Community present at a meeting called for the purpose; a quorum for such a meeting is 40% of the Members. In the event of the Minister's dismissal, his or her compensation shall be continued for 90 days after the date of dismissal.

F. Resignation

The Minister must give 90 days notice to resign, except that the Board of Trustees may allow shorter notice.

256 Article X. Committees

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A. Nominating Committee

A Nominating Committee of three (3) Members who are not Members of the Board of Trustees shall be elected at the Annual Congregational Business Meeting to serve a one-year term. An alternate shall also be elected for a one-year term, to serve on the committee if one of the Members is not able to fulfill their duties. The Nominating Committee shall nominate Board Members as specified in Article VIII.H, and the next Nominating Committee. If possible one (1) or more of the current Members shall be nominated for a second term. No Nominating Committee Member shall serve for more than two (2) consecutive terms. The meetings may be closed at the option of the committee.

B. Committee on Shared Ministry

The purpose of the Committee on Shared Ministry shall be to strengthen the quality of the shared and mutual ministry within the Community. On behalf of, and in light of the Community's mission, the Committee on Shared Ministry will systematically assess, report on, and make recommendations regarding the effectiveness of the Community's entire ministry in all of its inter-related facets.

The Committee on Shared Ministry shall consist of the Minister and three Members of the Community appointed to staggered three-year terms. Candidates are nominated by the Minister and appointed by the Board of Trustees. Committee Members may not concurrently serve on the Board of Trustees or in a staff position. Committee Members cannot serve two consecutive terms unless their first appointment was to fill an unfinished term and the duration of the unfinished term was less than one year. All meetings of the committee shall be open unless the need for confidentiality requires a closed session.

C. Other Committees

All other committees will be established and disbanded by the Board of Trustees to further the interests of the Community.

282 Article XI. Covenant Not to Discriminate

- The Community does not discriminate in the calling of a Minister or hiring practices on the basis of
- race, age, gender, sexual orientation, ethnic and national origin, social status, economic status, marital
- status, or disability. The Community does not discriminate in its governance, its activities, or the use of
- 286 its facilities on the basis of race, age, gender, sexual orientation, ethnic and national origin, social status,
- 287 economic status, marital status, or disability.

288 Article XII. Dissolution

- 289 In the case of dissolution of the Community, all of its property, real and personal, after paying all just
- claims upon it, shall be conveyed to and vested in the Unitarian Universalist Association or its legal
- successor, and the Board of Trustees of the Community shall perform all actions necessary to effectuate
- such conveyance.

293 Article XIII. Indemnification

- 294 UUCM shall indemnify any person who is or was an employee, trustee, agent, representative, Member
- of the Board of Trustees, or Endowment Committee volunteer of the UUCM against any liability
- asserted against such person and incurred in the course and scope of his or her duties or functions with
- 297 UUCM to the maximum extent allowable by law, provided the person acted in good faith and did not
- engage in an act or omission that is intentional, willfully or wantonly negligent, or done with conscious

- 299 indifference or reckless disregard for the safety of others. The provisions of this Article shall not be
- deemed exclusive of any other rights to which such person may be entitled under any bylaw, agreement,
- insurance policy, and vote of Members or otherwise.
- 302 Article XIV. Insurance
- 303 UUCM may purchase and maintain insurance on behalf of any person who is or was a Member, director,
- officer, employee, or agent against any liability asserted against such person and incurred by such
- person in any such capacity or arising out of such person's status as such, whether or not the corporation
- would have the power or obligation to indemnify such person against such liability under this Article.

307 Article XV. Amendments and Replacement

- These bylaws may be amended or replaced at any meeting of the Community subject to the conditions in
- 309 Article VII (Meetings).

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- A. Proposing Amendments
- Amendments to these bylaws may be proposed:
- 312 1) By the Board of Trustees, acting on its own motion, or,
 - 2) On the petition of at least ten (10) Members submitted to the Board at a Board meeting not less than forty-five (45) days before a Congregational Business Meeting.
 - B. Adopting Amendments
- Amendments to these bylaws may be adopted: At any Annual or Special Congregational
 Business Meeting by a two-thirds majority of the voting Members present and voting, provided
 the proposed amendment has been set forth in the notice of meeting sent to the Membership
 pursuant to Article VII of these bylaws. Approved amendment(s) take effect immediately after
- adoption, unless otherwise stated.
- 321 Article XVI. Effective Date Original bylaws (1995)
- 322 These by-laws take effect after approval by a 2/3 vote of the charter Members. People who become
- 323 Members within 30 days of the approval of the by-laws shall become charter Members and have voting
- privileges immediately. The initial Board will have one (1) at large Member with a one (1) year term
- and a President with a one (1) year term as well as the normal positions as stated in Article VIII. The
- first board starts immediately instead of the next fiscal year. People who are elected to the first board
- must become Members within one week of the election.
