

I love the change in the seasons, new plants in my garden, fresh paint, and new experiences. I love hearing new ideas, effecting positive change, reaching a goal, finishing a project and starting a new one. I love change - or at least I thought I did.

With everything that is going on at UUCM I thought of all the people who would

experience change and struggle with adjusting...transitioning. In an attempt to prepare the Community for the changes that lay ahead, I wrote a newsletter article in July that talked about change and transition. It never occurred to me that Iwould have to change too.

With the delay of the Mission Statement development, I felt derailed. I had lost my focus, my vision, my plan. I had no goal in site, no long-term project to work on. I was frustrated, disappointed, and confused. I knew I was being required to 'sit in the moment' and let things be. But I asked myself, "How can I do this for the months ahead?" The answer was...I'd have to change.

Attending the leadership class, "Serving With Grace" has been enlightening, but there it was again....I have to change. Then, within a week, there was the loss of two members of the Board which was going to require some adjustment from all of us...more change.

What are my choices? I could quit and just not deal with changing, or I could see it as an opportunity for something UUs call transformation. I will have to do things that are not my normal way of operating, develop new skills, look deeper into myself, and reach out in ways that are unfamiliar or uncomfortable.

I begin my journey by writing this article and knowing there are people in my Community that will be there to support me when I feel weak, and love me when I make a mistake, and lift me up when I falter. For this, I am grateful.
