If we all know from the beginning that I will be moving on in two years, we can be more lovingly honest with each other.

As I have been simultaneously both looking back wistfully and looking ahead excitedly, doubtless so have you as you have been considering the life of UUCM. You will have your personal and shared memories of Rev. Meghan's ministry, memories which might bring tears of loving appreciation and perhaps some tears of pain. There are always both in any meaningful relationship. The life of a congregation, like our own lives, ever consists of poignant leave-takings but also of glad welcomes. Even as you look back and consider your past, I hope you are also now looking forward with anticipation to what beckons in the future.

I have been a minister now for thirty three years. I hope I have picked up a few skills along the way which will be of benefit to UUCM. I know that in return I will have much to learn and benefit from you.

In anticipation of the Sept 1 arrival of our interim minister, David Usher, a Transition Team has been formed to support our new minister. This team will help him connect with our UUCM history, our lay leaders, staff, and our UU community at large. The team will also be a resource to him as he settles into his personal life in a new community in a new country. Serving on the Transition Team are Lindsay Dunkel and Keith Johnson, as well as Susan Sanford who will be serving as point person for the team.

Wipe Your Print

Wanton printing at the office (and in your home) doesn't just waste paper. It also wastes toner, which is rough on the environment, and the highly packaged cartridge it comes in. And it's expensive - a 2006 cost comparison found that printer ink costs \$66 per ounce, compared to \$44 an ounce for Chanel No. 5 and a mere \$5 an ounce for Dom Perignon! To get the most out of your cartridges, set your default print settings to "draft". When printer cartridges run low, give them a shake to get at the last bits of ink. Finally, always ask yourself if you really need that printed document: store your files electronically instead.

Berry Apricot salsa

Try this sweet salsa as a topping for pancakes,yogurt or in the center of a small melon

1 c raspberries, divided

2 Tbsp apricot preserves

1 c diced fresh apricots, nectarines or peaches

1 c fresh blackberries

3 Tbsp chopped candied ginger

Mash 4 raspberries in a bowl, stir in preserves to make sauce base

Add fresh apricots, remaining raspberries, blackberries and ginger.

Toss to coat being careful to keep berries whole.

Let stand 5-10 min to allow flavors to meld


Hot off the press! If you have been wanting to get more
