Minister's Letter

Rev. David Usher UUCM Interim Minister

Dear Friends,

I wonder who your new settled minister will be. Of course I am curious to know who will be taking over UUCM's ministerial reins, especially now as the Search Committee is entering the crucial stage of actually meeting with the interested applicants and the time approaches when they will announce their chosen candidate. I suspect you are more than mildly curious and excited as well.

The Beyond Categorical Thinking Workshop, hosted by the Search Committee last November and so ably led by Jo Victoria, was designed to overcome expectations based on ill-considered stereotypes (the minister must be 28 years old with 40 years experience; must have a family but work 80 hours a week; must spend several hours each day making pastoral calls and always be in the office when needed, etc.), and the Survey has helped the Search Committee to know the congregation's profile very well.

But however thorough the preparation, however scientific the process, ultimately a settled ministry is about a relationship that cannot be neatly quantified. Like internet dating, you can write all sorts of flattering things about yourself, and define all sorts of desiderata in a prospective mate, but the real question cannot be answered until you actually meet.

Are you a fit? Can you as a congregation be in meaningful relationship with each other? Not just you personally, but you as a congregation.

I am very excited for you. I hope you are excited for you too.

Mountain Chalice to Experiment with Different Frequency

One of the findings from the recent survey about The Mountain Chalice was that a significant number of the 54 respondents agreed that changing the frequency from monthly to every two months would be a more efficient use of the substantial staff and volunteer time it takes to produce it.

As an experiment, the February issue will remain as normal, for one month only, but the next two issues will be for March/April and May/June.

To compensate, the weekly eChalice will give notice for programs and events in the coming two weeks, and the Board and committees will make greater use of UU General for the dissemination of information about governance and other institutional business.

Ministry Tracker is a fully-featured church management software package that exceeds our current database software needs as expressed by the stakeholders in this project; the administrator, the minister, Membership, Stewardship, and Religious Education committees. It is backed by an established and reputable company that is exceptionally energized and engaged with its work. The new software will streamline many processes for our administrator and Committees; e.g. we will now have just one data base to update, not three.

There was an extensive and comprehensive process to select this software. The Board wants to give a great big thank you to Conrad for his tenacity and dedication to finding the best software for UUCM, we couldn't have done this without him. We sincerely thank his hard working and talented team as well; Dave Canan, Phil Hart, and Carol Holliman, especially to Carol who was instrumental in shaping and guiding the selection process. We also thank the stakeholders who invested their time and talent to the selection process; Janet Dunstan, Beryl Maclean Beckwith, Claire Miller, David Usher, and Kathryn Young, especially Beryl, who worked as both a stakeholder and a team member in the critical final stages of the selection process.

The work of installation, data migration and training has yet to be done, but in the next months Ministry Tracker will be up and running. Once we make the transition, we will not access member information through Congregation Builder any longer and yes this will require some patience as we all learn how to use new church software; however, the benefits will be well worth the investment required when learning something new.

Boy, it feels great to accomplish these big things!
