#### Dear Friends,

I must begin with a thank you to all of you who helped welcome me so warmly in July and August. I have appreciated your thoughtful generosity and kind gestures. Your words and actions have helped ease the challenges that come with entering a significant life and geographic transition. Offers of meals and excursions and concerts and delicious garden vegetables arrive steadily, and I continue to be grateful. Already and often I have seen you offer this kind of care to each other too, and I recognize that it is a wonderful strength of this UUCM community.

After two years in the sea island low country of South Carolina (beautiful and flat), I'm extra aware of the dramatic vertical contours of the landscape here (beautiful and not so flat). I'm enjoying the significant ups and downs of the streets and the hiking paths, one of the many appeals of this area for me. The exercise is heart strengthening. I'm also gradually gaining deeper insight into the vertical contours of UUCM as a congregation, the ups and downs that you navigate or will need to navigate together, both within the congregation and in the wider community. Truth be told, these too were draws for me at some level (Ask the search committee!). These efforts too can be powerfully heart strengthening, and I hope for and expect them to be so for all of us.

After several years of many changes at UUCM and strongly felt and expressed emotions, I know that you arrive at this threshold in the journey cautious and wary, some of you; excited and rarin' to go, some of you; hopeful, yet tender, some of you; and feeling isolated and wounded, some of you. Perhaps you feel several or all of those emotions at once, or perhaps you are brand new and wondering what I'm talking about. I'm talking about the nature of being in community and finding our way together into a world of ever greater kindness, compassion, justice and love. There are hills in every direction - some up, some down, some with wildly winding routes, some with incredible views. The journey, however it unfolds, stands to strengthen our hearts beyond belief.

I'll continue to watch and listen and learn as I discern how I can best be of service to UUCM. I also want to say, "Ready? Here we go!"

## Board of Trustees August 9, 2016 Meeting Highlights

- The meeting was visited by several congregation members who were warmly welcomed by the Board. Anita Wald-Tuttle had requested to address the Board and spoke about the August 16 Roy Zimmerman concert at UUCM.
- The Board authorized a Governance Work Group whose purpose is to research, study and make recommendations to the Board. We want to find ways that UUCM might better govern itself in light of past problems and issues.
   We will keep the congregation up to date on the work and there will be opportunities for members to engage directly with the Board and work group. More information will be coming. (Please see prior article for more details).
- Religious Education Planning: The Board reviewed a report from R.E. Consultant Kristin Famula. We discussed the new program being developed, timing and budget considerations, and hiring the DRE and a childcare provider for Sunday services.
- Communication with the congregation was discussed including feedback on Town Talks. Rev. Kevin, Kern and Beth agreed to address short term communication from the Board and big picture communication within the congregation.
- Pacific Western Region (PWR) offers a start-up workshop for congregations with a new settled minister. The workshop will be scheduled for the fall and paid for by the funds remaining from the Ministerial Search Committee budget.
- The Board has been working on an action plan to address the important issues for UUCM. It will consider priorities, timing, and appropriate actions to be taken. Dave requested feedback on the plan. The Start-up Workshop will help the Board formulate ideas for the year ahead.

A happy summer to all! I'm hopeful we all have had some opportunity this summer to explore the more personal relevancy of living our seven key UU principles. After being reappointed by the Board for what is a second 2-year term as Stewardship Chair, for myself this has also included a focused contemplation about what our UUCM Stewardship Program has accomplished over the last couple of years. By all means we should feel very proud as a congregation, because together:

- we became aware that through an intentional and authentic paradigm shift of inspiration and commitment of our personal resources to our UU faith, we are capable of fulfilling our ministries through the generosity of spirit and pledge revenue
- ➤ we shifted to a culture where we can talk about money as a congregation we don't shy away from the conversations or the "ask"
- we emphasized the importance of supporting our ministries with our pledge revenue as a community, not just paying the mortgage, light bill and minister's salary
- we created and completed a new design and format for our annual pledge campaign based on a theme of the spiritual benefits that can come from generosity; focusing on not everyone being in a position to give at the same level but rather that everyone can be generous within their means
- we aimed for some substantive overall pledge revenue increases in creating our 2015-16FY and 2016-17FY budgets and have largely landed on those targets
- we successfully executed numerous Stewardship sponsored fundraising events to meet our budget and are beginning in earnest to develop a separate fundraising arm at UUCM
- we are continuing to lay the groundwork for generosity in all things as it relates to actions for daily congregational life - how we can infuse this concept in our congregations by looking at praise and gratitude, the assumption of good faith around process, attentive listening, mentorship and perhaps most importantly, embracing change through the lens of generosity
- we are building the stepping stones towards better stewarding of beloved community both within and beyond UUCM's congregational walls

 we are looking to restructure our Stewardship committee to better serve our community internally and externally

I'm inspired and encouraged to have Rev. Kevin in the house to support and work with us as we move UUCM's Stewardship development plans forward in the coming years. This work done together will be rewarding in a multitude of ways on many levels – something important for us all to nurture and work on collaboratively as a congregation!

Stay tuned for Stewardship development updates and please consider joining the work of this important team at UUCM – it takes our village to make things happen, and at the moment we need to expand this group to include more of the congregation!



## Announcing our New Online Directory for Members & Friends

I'm excited to invite you all to explore our new online Member & Friend directory. Starting in September, we will no longer be maintaining our contact records in Congregation Builder. Our new directory will be on a platform called "Ministry Tracker". Be on the lookout for an email from me about accessing the new directory for the first time. It will contain a personalized link for you to click. When you click this link, you'll be asked to pick a username and a password, and to agree to Ministry Tracker's terms of use. Once you've done that, you'll be all set to edit your profile and use the directory. You'll notice that all of the data we had in Congregation Builder has been transferred over, but you may want to edit or augment that information.

The new directory will allow members and friends to post things like profile pictures, emergency contact information, and interests and hobbies to your profile page. All fields on the profile page are optional, and fields like "emergency contacts" will only be visible to UUCM staff and relevant volunteers. You can view and edit your family's profile under the "Profile" tab.





Under the "Directory" tab, you'll be able to search for members and friends using the search box towards the top of the page, or by choosing the first letter of a person or family's last name to the right of the page.



In the directory, there are individual listings for each person, as well as family listings for each family. Families are listed by the parent or guardian name(s); kids and youth will appear as individual listings, as well as in families. Non-member/friend spouses are listed in the directory if they were listed in the Congregation Builder directory. If you are a member or a friend and would like you non-member/friend spouse to be listed in the directory, please let me know.



A particularly cool feature of this new directory is the ability to see all of the groups at UUCM, including all members & friends who are a part of each group. You can do this by going to the "Groups" tab. Please

contact me if you'd like to be

added to or deleted from any of these groups in the Member and Friend directory.

## International Women's Convocation February 16-19, 2017 Monterey Peninsula, CA


