Diesel: An Assault On the Entire Body

Particulate matter isn't made up of any one chemical or compound. It is instead a "mixture of mixtures," in the words of the EPA.

Diesel PM 2.5 Particle
 2.5 microns or less wide

Human hair shaft
50-70 microns wide


More than 90 percent of diesel particulate matter is smaller than 1 micron in diameter—or about 1/70th the width of a human hair. This places it in the category of PM 2.5 pollution, or irritants that are smaller than 2.5 microns.

In the **lungs**, PM 2.5 pollution is associated with respiratory illnesses such as asthma, COPD, and lung cancer, as well as greater susceptibility to COVID.

Particles in the **bloodstream** increase the risk of chronic **kidney disease** and can impair the functioning of the **liver**, spleen, and even the **brain**.

Diesel particulate pollution has also been identified as a threat during pregnancy, increasing the risk of preterm delivery and low birth weight.

POSSIBLE MINE MITIGATION STRATEGIES:

Proposed:

- Tier 4 Diesel Engines (regulate the amt of Partiulate Matter and NO2 gas that can be emitted)
- Filters on the mine ventilation fan(s) for the smallest particles
- Keep the mine dust wetted down
- Rinsing truck tires before leaving the work sites
- Tarps to cover extracted material

Rise Gold "Economics 101"

- 1) Economic studies often present an incomplete picture.
- 2) The modeling software used in the Rise study is frequently used.
- 3) The Rise study and the County's independent study (RDN) use the same software.
- 4) I am not saying the County did anything wrong in selecting RDN.
- 5) The software is broadly used in the industry and RDN has an excellent reputation.
- 6) People need to know how the software impacts what the studies show.

Key Economic Software Issues

- 1) The software is designed to make project proposals look good.
- 2) The software is designed NOT to show economic risk.
- 3) The software has a bias towards applicants.
- 4) By design, the outcomes are always positive.
- 5) "Indirect jobs" may be part-time and full-time jobs.
- 6) Revenue and other economic benefits are all treated as if they were "Spent" in Nevada County.
- 7) In reality a large percentage of revenue and benefits will NOT be "Spent" in Nevada County.

"In Nevada County" means dollars that are "Generated" in Nevada County. It does not mean "Spent" in Nevada County.

Rise Economic Plan is Misleading & Inaccurate

- 1) Revenue (\$159million) based on historical models from the 1940's and 1950's.
- 2) "In Nevada County" does not mean \$'s are spent in Nevada County.
- 3) "Supplier Spending" of \$12.5 million "In Nevada County" is overstated by at least half.
- 4) Claim of 300 "Indirect jobs" and associated benefits are overstated, again by probably half.
- 5) Projected Total Annual Economic Impact "In Nevada County" represent dollars "Generated" in Nevada County but are overstated by at least half.

 - "just show up and sit in the chamber to support those who speak... and/or after a speaker, go up and say you agree with what was just said/presented and I am against the reopening of the mine."



- 3) Raney publishes a Final EIR which includes responses to public comments on the Draft EIR; and
- 4) County decision makers review the Final EIR, certify the environmental document and consider approval of the Use Permit and Reclamation Plan at a public hearing.
